Welcoming many new families into the programs

We opened the doors to a out of school care program in the west site to support the school aged children in the community. In September. The program has created 45 new spaces for children.



Advocating for high quality child care programs





Expenses 2023





PARENT MESSAGE



Thank you Wipac Macihta/Alder Academy for an amazing few years. It's hard to describe how much I treasure the time my children have spent in the program. We have had many varied daycare experiences before we and this has been our favorite place. The care and attention as well as the respect for all who come through the doors has always been noted and appreciated. When I think back to my own childhood I remember the centre I went to as a child and the wonderful relationship my mom had with the owner. I noted how important the support was that she received as a single mother and how I benefited from their care. I am lucky we have found a similar realm of a supportive environment for my children. I have seen great care in the roles people play at the center over the years - from how impeccably clean the center is, the delicious meals prepared for my children, but one of my favorite is the first friendships my daughter developed with those who work and attend the center. The biggest thing is that I am thankful for the cultural connections my children made here. Every time I hear them speak or sing in Cree I feel a deep connection in my heart, a blood memory that connects to the generations in my family. While ${\mathcal I}$ did not grow up speaking Cree, I remember hearing my great Grandma speaking it when I was their age. In school and childcare I never experienced positive discussions around being Indigenous and was taught that even though we were proud to be Metis we should hide it. So J guess by seeing positive modelling by those who share their community connections with my children and the staff who respectfully learned the culture it felt like I was healing. I have healed from this experience while also witnessing my children grow in the very best way because of all your consistent and generous efforts. There is love here (sakihiwewin) and I am grateful for all of you.
